## <u>English</u>

Topics of Importance:

#### Unit 10: It's hot today!

Students will need to be familiar with the following topics from Unit 10 (pages 74-79):

- Identifying different types of weather from pictures.

- Using sentences to describe weather and activities/actions, (It's sunny. We can go outside. **and/or** It's hot. Don't open the window.)

Unit 11: What are you wearing?

Students will need to be familiar with the following topics from Unit 11 (pages 80-85).

- Identification of clothes and using adjectives to describe them (He's wearing a green scarf.)

- When to use **This is a/an** (singular ending) or **These are** (plural ending) when describing clothes (This is a green shirt / These are red boots).

- Times with an emphasis on the location of the minute and hour hand for **o'clock**, **quarter past**, **half past**, **quarter to**.

Unit 12: You're sleeping!

Students will need to be familiar with the following topics from Unit 12 (pages 86-91).

- Using and identifying verbs in the **present continuous** (talk = talking).

- Using pronoun contractions (I'm, They're, We're) along with a present continuous verb to answer "What are you/they doing?"

1. Students will need to read clocks and write the correct times. They should be familiar with the vocab: half past, quarter past, quarter to.

2. Students need to be familiar with vocab from Unit 12 to fill in the missing words in the sentences. They must spell the words correctly.

3. Students must identify different items of clothing and put them in sentences using 'This is' or 'These are'.

4. Students will be presented with ten words. They must decide which are verbs and which are adjectives.

Students will need to be able to identify different shapes.

- Identify solid and 3 dimensional figures.
- Listen to 2 and 3 dimensional figures and colour the right figure.
