Our school appreciates the interest of all parents who attended the special lecture on Roles of Parents in Fostering Children in the 4.0 Era: Seeing Through the Influence of Social Media given by Associate Professor Suriyadeo Tripathi, MD (Director of the National Institute of Child and Family Development) on Saturday February 2nd, 2019.

For this special occasion, we would like to highlight some points from the book The Cost of Life of Thai Children and Youth written by Associate Professor Suriyadeo Tripathi. The author states that schools are really important to children because they are places where children gain knowledge and have their mental and physical health developed so that they grow up to become quality adults.

Aside from classroom learning, joining in activities they like is also something that encourages them to learn independently and happily. They also get a chance to build their skills, to analyze, and try something by themselves. These give them more understanding about what they are doing, and they also learn to live with others harmoniously.

In addition, the environment of the school is essential and much attention to it is needed. This is because children spend most of their time in schools. Schools must be free from certain vices which include:



If the school is free from these vices, the chances of children getting exposed to risks or harms are also reduced. Furthermore, children's potential will be also developed.

Even when the school has completed its responsibilities in developing children to be quality adults, love, understanding and care from families, communities, and society are also essential for children if they are to develop their potential creatively.

Children are just like different kinds of seeds which need time to grow into trees. These various kinds of trees eventually fulfill each other and maintain their feelings of pride.










Teenagers and the day of Love

Parents who wish to withdraw their children from school for semester 1/2019 must submit a withdrawal

request at the Administration Office on or before 30th April 2019

Submitting the withdrawal request after the aforementioned date is considered to be in breach of the school's regulations

parents must pay for the tuition fee for Semester 1/2019 before receiving academic documents and other student certificates.

* Except for KG.3, Year 6, and Year 9 students of academic year 2018, the due dates and the resignation rules are stated on their Intention Inquiry Document.

Requesting Visa online

To make it more convenient for our parents, school provides a service for parents to submit a student visa online (VISA Request Letter) through school's website.

Please make sure you submit all information correctly and follow all the instructions.



After we receive the information, the school will process it within two working days.

Please be advised that parents with outstanding fee payments will receive the document within 7 working days and only after all outstanding fees have been paid may parents collect the visa letter. (If parents make a payment by cheque, parents will receive the requested document(s), seven working days after the payment.)

Asking for school documents

If parents need any school documents for students, they can submit a request at the admin office. It takes about 5 - 7 days to prepare the documents after the request is submitted. For parents who still have outstanding fees, these must be settled (paid) before collecting the documents.
