


Follow instructions of the school's staff who are on Traffic duty.

For students who have not been reserved on a course yet, you can apply for the tutorial course and start your course in July by checking courses' availability, apply, and pay for course charges at administration office. The benefits of taking an after-school course are:

## Sweet, Fatty, and Fried Food Consumption Reduction Project

This year, Sarasas Ektra initiates a project related to healthy food consumption promotion "Sweet, Fatty, and Fried Food Consumption Reduction, and Vegetable & Fruit Consumption Promotion".

The aim of the project is to promote good health of students and to prevent obesity.

According to the data from Health Data Center (HDC), Ministry of Public Health, it was found that Thus, the school emphasizes on providing a low fat lunch. In terms of food stalls and shops, they are encour-

11.4% of school age children had overweight and obesity problems in 2015, and such percentage increased to 12.5% in 2016.

For children with severe obesity, negative effects toward respiratory system might be found. The risk of congestion of Carbon Dioxide is possible which results in Pickwickian Syndrome.

School age children with obesity, posses high risk of developing other fatal diseases such as Heart Disease, Hyperlipidemia, Diabetes, Arthritis, Bowlegs, including Attention Deficit Disorder.

aged to reduce sugar in different drinks sold and sell less fried food & chocolate. Additionally, various healthy menus of breakfast are sold during morning time to promote good health. During this period, we have encouraged sellers to avoid selling fried food.

Student health promotion scheme needs cooperation both from school officials and parents regarding the building of right understanding in terms of food selection. It is essential that students choose nutritious food and dine on time, have regular physical activities, and avoid snacking. These disciplines need to be taught and instilled to all students for it to become a positive habit, part of their routine. It will also encourage and promote other areas of a child development (such as academic achievement).
